

Songs of the season

The best sellers of Christmastime

OR A QUIRKY lesson in U.S. history, consider the origins of the secular Christmas songs played on the radio and broadcast into the ears of harried shoppers every December. From war to racism to the tuberculosis epidemic, our national past crops up in startling ways through the stories of songwriters and performers.

"Jingle Bells" was apparently inspired by the annual sleigh races held around Thanksgiving in Medford, Massachusetts. Medford native James Lord Pierpont, the uncle of J. P. Morgan, composed the song in the 1850s, although it's not clear whether he wrote it in Medford or in Savannah, Georgia. Both cities have

The son of a minister, he ran away from boarding school at 14, found a job on a whaling ship, and spent a decade at sea. He returned to marry and have children, then abandoned his family to join the California Gold Rush. Failing to strike it rich, he wound up in Savannah, playing the organ in his abolitionist brother's Unitarian church. During the Civil War,

Pierpont enlisted as clerk for a Southern cavalry company and wrote Confederate battle songs, while his brother fled north, and their father served as chaplain for the Union army.

Back in 1857, Pierpont's jolly winter song was published as "One-Horse Open Sleigh," but it soon became known by the words of the famous refrain. Just over a century later, in December 1965, "Jingle Bells" became the first song broadcast from space. After the two astronauts aboard Gemini 6 had completed their rendezvous with Gemini 7, the crew reported to Mission Control that they had spotted an unidentified flying object "up in a polar orbit." In the midst of the transmission, pranksters Wally Schirra and Tom Stafford broke into a rendition

"WINTER WONDERLAND" STARTED AS A poem written by Richard Smith in the

winter of 1934, when he was a tuberculosis patient at a sanitarium in Honesdale, Pennsylvania. TB was the single greatest cause of death in the nation during the late 1800s and early 1900s. To occupy himself while under treat-

sician friend Felix Bernard was moved by the poem and composed a cheerful melody to fit the words.

Smith died the following year, at the age of 34. Bernard went on to achieve success in the music business.

"RUDOLPH, THE RED-NOSED REINdeer" was the creation of Bob May, an ad writer for the Montgomery Ward mailorder and department-store business. He lived in Chicago with his four-yearold daughter Barbara and his wife Evelyn, who was dying of cancer. Barbara asked her father why her mother was so different from other mothers, and he responded by making up a story about a reindeer whose difference turned out to be an indispensable virtue.

The little girl loved the story so much that she made him tell it every night before she went to sleep. Bob was deep in debt and couldn't afford to buy his daughter a Christmas present, so he made the story into a hand-drawn picture book.

Evelyn died in early December 1938. Just before Christmas, Montgomery Ward held a company party, where Bob's coworkers asked him to read the Rudolph story, which drew a standing ovation. To help Bob pay off his debts, Montgomery Ward bought the rights to the book and gave six million copies away to shoppers over the next six years.

Publishing houses across the country were clamoring to acquire the book. It's to Montgomery Ward's credit that the company restored the rights to its author,

who soon became a millionaire.

Bob's brother-in-law, songwriter Johnny Marks, wrote a tune for the Rudolph story and offered it to Bing Crosby and other singers. They all turned it down. Although Gene Autry's "Here Comes Santa Claus" had been a hit, the cowboy singer was unimpressed by "Rudolph." But his wife Ina was so touched by the lines, "They wouldn't let poor Rudolph / play in any reindeer games," that she urged her husband to record the song. "Rudolph, the Red-Nosed Reindeer" became the nation's second-best-selling Christmas song.

"White Christmas," the top-selling Christmas song, was written in 1938 by Jewish composer Irving Berlin, who grew up on New York City's Lower East Side. His three-week-old son had died on Christmas Day in 1928, so it's possible that the wistful yearning of the song relates to mourning for the child. The composition was put to use when Berlin was hired by Paramount to write for a musical that became the film *Holiday Inn*, starring Bing Crosby.

"White Christmas" was first broadcast to the public on Christmas Eve, 1941, during Crosby's radio show, a few weeks after the bombing of Pearl Harbor. During the war, when he performed at USO shows, Crosby was reluctant to include the song because he didn't want to make the soldiers homesick. When he tried to cut it from his setlist, the men requested it anyway.

"THE CHRISTMAS SONG," POPULARLY known by its first line, "Chestnuts roasting on an open fire," was written in Los Angeles on a sultry summer day in 1945. Crooner and composer Mel Tormé met

with lyricist Bob Wells to write a couple of songs for a musical. Hoping to cool himself off in the heat, Wells dashed off a few lines of poetry recalling his childhood winters in Boston, where vendors

roasted chestnuts over handcarts on the

When Tormé read the four lines, he immediately came up with a tune, and they completed the song together. A year later, Tormé offered it to his friend Nat King Cole, who recognized the song's commercial potential. However, Cole was not yet a household name, and all Christmas music was then recorded by white singers. His label, Capitol Records, initially turned down the song because they didn't think they could sell it to white buyers. Then Cole's "(I Love You) For Sentimental Reasons" became a smash hit, and six weeks later, he was able to record "The

"I SAW MOMMY KISSING SANTA CLAUS" was recorded in 1953 by 13-year-old Jimmy Boyd. The novelty record was banned in Boston and other places because of the possibility that the mother in the song was having an affair, although the lyrics imply that she's actually kissing her husband. Columbia Records asked the Council of Churches for assistance, and they sent Boyd around to convince the radio stations that the song was squeaky clean. It then became a solid Christmas hit, selling over three





A bountiful harvest of lights

Stone Ridge Orchard hosts Lumagica's Winter Garden through January 3

RE CHRISTMAS LIGHT displays a highlight of the season's magical allure for you? Do you make a point of find-

ing out which streets in which towns reliably put up the most extravagant illuminated holiday decorations, and then go see them in person?

If you're that kind of person, you've undoubtedly noticed in the past few years an upsurge in the number of "light parks" hosted as seasonal tourist attractions in various locations. In the mid-Hudson, Headless Horseman Haunted Attractions in Ulster Park has been shifting gears each December to a less-scary immersive experience called A Frosty Fest. More recently, those willing to travel farther afield have been drawn to wintry light attractions at the Bronx Botanical Gardens in Manhattan, and to several sites in Connecticut created by a German company called MK Illumination.

Marketed under the label of Lumagica, the MK attractions first appeared in Hückelhoven, Germany in 2018 and quickly spread to other European sites. For 2022, the company is organizing major light parks in 23 countries, including Denmark, Sweden, the UK, Japan, Canada and the US.

Lumagica also creates smaller installations for town squares, building lobbies,



airports, train stations and festivals - all featuring sculptures made from strings of LED lights.

The big holiday displays each have a theme. Enchanted Forest is this year's offering at Harvest Moon Farm & Orchard in the Westchester County town of North Salem, for example. Last year, Harvest Moon became the first farm to host a Lumagica holiday light park in the US.

This year, a new farm site has been added to the list - the first one in the mid-Hudson region: Stone Ridge Orchard at 3012 Route 213 in Stone Ridge, a little southeast of Route 209. The attraction,

dubbed Winter Garden, was unveiled at Stone Ridge Orchard on November 18 and will be open most nights through January 3.

Your hosts describe this attraction as "... a walking tour through a magical garden. A deep freeze has swept into the garden at Stone Ridge. You can help Zinnia, the colorful hummingbird, restore the color and life to the garden. As you make your way through, remember to make a wish with the shooting stars."

The trail is about a half-mile in length, over uneven terrain and rutted farm roads with wet spots. It requires at least 45 minutes to view at a leisurely strolling pace, allowing plenty of stops for photography. Comfortable walking shoes, preferably hiking boots, are strongly encouraged.

All the Lumagica light parks are site-specific in design, and the layout for Winter Garden takes advantage of the varying viewscapes offered by the orchard's rolling hillsides – not to mention the trees: The sculptural centerpiece of Zinnia the hummingbird and a delicate cluster of fluffy dandelions is positioned at the base of a majestic 360-year-old white oak, itself bathed in a floodlight whose colors gradually change.

Existing farm structures are incorporated into the layout of the light displays.

Thus, some of the sculptures are free-standing, such as the family groupings of foxes, deer, swans and penguins (not to mention a 14-foot-tall moose this five-foor-seven-inch reporter didn't need to duck to pass under), while other patterns of lights are held aloft by tree trunks and branches, tunnels and trellises. Clusters of sculptures represent "The Deep Freeze," "Tales of Time," "The Tree of Life," "Colorful Trees," "Nature by the Pond" and "The Shooting Stars."

The progression of lights – half a million of them all told – is designed to reinforce the Winter Garden storyline through color scheme as well, evolving gradually from chilly blues and whites at the outset to more varied and vibrant hues. By the time you reach the oak tree and the hummingbird at the top of the hill, you realize that now the colors are shifting through the entire spectrum.



Ingenious ideas are innumerable

ow about a moneyless Christmas – a holiday that costs you nothing? It seems like a shame to go into debt to celebrate the birth of Jesus, who said: "Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and dust doth corrupt ..." (All the other winter holidays also may be celebrated in this fashion.)

One idea: ask only for re-gifts (i.e. presents your friends previously received and didn't want). Or for objects people find on the ground: a pretty rock (or even a rather inexpressive rock) or a flaming red-orange leaf.

Another possibility is conceptual presents. Yoko Ono's classic book *Grapefruit* contains lots of intriguing gift ideas. For example:

Counting Piece III

Count the numbers of wrinkles on your face or your body or certain parts of your body. Send it to your friend in place of a letter.

There's the old standby: the massage coupon. I suggest that you specify the type of massage – for example "foot massage" (or even more specific: "left foot massage").

A piece of advice: Don't use the massage as an opportunity to seduce the person. That's technically known as "massage abuse."

A poem makes an excellent gift. You can copy one out of a book, or write one yourself. Here it is a recent composition of mine that would suffice as a holiday present:

Massachusetts

Massachusetts frightens me a little – even the word.

If you're left-handed, do you ever write

with your right hand? And do you write lefthandedly if you're a righty? Try it! It makes a heartfelt gift. Copy out a poem with the opposite hand, then tell your gift receiver, "I became ambidextrous for you."

Or paint a small watercolor! An oil painting demands too much of a commitment from the recipient, but a watercolor may be lost among a pile of papers, or simply recycled.

For many years I would ask people to bring me cassettes they were sick of to my birthday party. Later, I amended this to include CDs. My favorite gift of this type was an album by the Turkish rock group Kurban. Also I discovered that I deeply love the song "Ventura Highway" by America, though I can't explain why.

Almost every book I read costs me nothing. I go to book exchanges (like that wooden box in the center of Woodstock full of castoff paperbacks), and the free shelves of thrift shops. I even look in garbage cans. (Once my neighbor threw away *Lobotomy*, a memoir by Dee Dee Ramone, and while reading it I realized that I worked with Dee Dee in the mailroom of an insurance company in 1971 – three years before The Ramones began.) So start scouring tables in church basements for nifty novels to offer your comrades.

But please wrap every gift, even if you found it on the sidewalk! People love unwrapping presents, a little more than they love the presents themselves. And don't buy wrapping paper! My wife and I have a bag of colorful gift wrap we've accumulated over the years.

When I'm in New York City I sometimes find a Chinese newspaper in the garbage which makes satisfying present-covering. And a couple years ago, I decided to discard an old paperback atlas. Now I rip out the pages and use them to clothe gift items. My recipients invariably become fascinated, after briefly examining their present, with the geography of Tunisia (or whatever nation they've been given).

Maps-as-gift wrap saves money and educates Americans about world geography!


And how about leftovers? They don't cost anything. Place the remnants of a recent meal in a plastic container, wrap it, and hope for the best! Of course, not too many people want leftovers as a Hanukkah gift, unless they are extremely hungry, or you're an exemplary cook. But it's worth a try.

The fabric equivalent of leftovers is hand-me-downs. Find an article of clothing you no longer love, and give it to a person you still enjoy. Everything looks a lot newer when it's wrapped in decorative paper.
