

Summer nightlife

Your guide to Ulster County's hottest after-hours destinations

s the midnight hour approaches on a hot Ulster County summer night, most of our towns and hamlets are all tucked in for bed. But night owls need not worry: Our county does have a simmering summer nightlife if you know where to look.

What qualifies as nightlife? It's somewhat arbitrary, but my criteria is: "Are there multiple bars, restaurants and music venues open past 10 p.m. and within walking distance of each other?" I wholeheartedly recommend spending

a wild night out in Woodstock, Kingston or New Paltz.

Perhaps the best way to highlight the greatest nightlife attractions each spot has to offer is to imagine the ultimate crawl in each locale.

Woodstock

You might not think a town of less than 6000 could be one of the main nightlife attractions in the region, but let's be real. This is Woodstock we're talking about. There's been a party here since the turn of the century, when adventurous artists took to the woods to form their own creative colonies.

In 2024, Woodstock is decidedly less hippified than it was even a couple of decades ago, with head shops replaced by real-estate offices and once-seedy bars now renovated to look like they're straight out of Brooklyn.

The village green is operating at only a fraction of its former freakiness. And gone are the days when the Rainbow-Gathering people got naked around a bonfire up at the Magic Meadow. Today, much of Woodstock's tie-dyed, free-lovin' mythos lives in museums and merchandise.

Things still can get freaky, though. The people of Woodstock's nightlife are

perhaps its most fun and unpredictable asset, but the town also boasts some great after-hours live-music venues, still taking seriously its reputation as a music haven (at least for those not supporting draconian Nimby noise ordinances). I'd recommend starting at Station Bar, where you can often catch a live honkytonk band in the large outdoor area, then dip inside into a super-eclectic

atmosphere that ranges from antique ski lodge to Seventies basement game room. You're bound to run in some real Woodstock locals tying one on, and the staff themselves are colorful characters.

Definitely visit Colony, with its professional-gradestage and sprawling outdoor beer garden. You can catch live music here most nights, everything from tribute bands to local acts, karaoke, dance parties and open mics. The food here is quite tasty, and the full bar will keep you lubricated.

Make time for a top-shelf cocktail at Early Terrible, where the ambience is rustic chic, and the food and drink pricey but well-curated.

Right across the street is Pearl Moon Woodstock, where late-night music lives – often some eminently danceable mix of funk, jazz, rock and R&B. Shows here sometimes don't even start until 9 or 9:30 p.m.

Tinker Street Tavern is a fun bar to visit for its classic Woodstock ambience dialed up a notch with better-than-average bar food and a great drink selection. It's casual but classy with a decent karaoke scene, and open past midnight on the weekends.

And while not within walking distance, don't forget Bearsville Theater, which has awakened from its slumber to offer a full bill of accomplished musical acts. It's a super-fun place to see a show, have a few drinks and kick back.

If you've still got energy at the end of the night, you could hit up Big Deep for some spirit-of-Woodstock-approved skinny-dipping. Actually, I'm not sure how legal that is. You didn't hear it from me.

Kingston

After an unfortunate real-estate dealled to stilling the beating heart of Kingston's nightlife years ago as the massive music venue BSP closed, it understandably took the city a while to bounce back.

In 2024, Kingston nightlife has officially returned, albeit with a more Brooklynized vibe (what else is new?)

Somehow Tubby's has filled BSP's spiritual shoes while being about 1/25th of the size. Perhaps that's the charm – shows here are super-intimate (and frequently sold out), and the musicians being booked here rival those that headlined the much-bigger BSP back room.

Like a miniature UPAC, Tubby's is often where larger artists go to enjoy the energy of a smaller venue, swinging through after a tour date in NYC. Besides the always-stellar music (you can watch and hear the show from the bar and hear it on the outdoor patio), Tubby's has really good drinks at reasonable prices, and often some tasty pop-up food. This is where Kingston's communal spirit lives on, and any music-lover will feel right at home.

Salt Box is a choice late-night hang in Kingston, appreciated by locals and tourists for its mirthful staff, its maze-like arrangement of colorful rooms and outdoor areas (a smoker's paradise), and its well-made cocktails. Karaoke on Sundays is a wild scene.

The best cocktail you can drink in Kingston after 10 p.m. will be made at Stockade Tavern. This place pioneered the kinds of speakeasy-style, old-fashioned drinks you can now find at least one of on most local menus. Its staff are super-cool, the atmosphere is cozy, and every glass is filled with love.

Snapper Magee's is under new ownership but no less divey. Frequented by

hard-drinking 20-and-30-somethings, you'll also find a smattering of older locals and curious tourists wandering in after having a few too many. Sometimes open to the legal limit of 4 a.m., Snapper's has been the finish line for many late-night drinking adventures, and the atmosphere can still get crazy when the right combination of people bump into each other. Chic's Sports Bar and Kelly's Shamrock Tavern are even more divey if you're into more of a freewheeling afterhours atmosphere.

The newly opened Unicorn Bar is a fun place to visit for people of any persuasion, and the scene is specifically warm and welcoming to the LGBTQ+crowd. They're open 'til midnight on the weekends with a stunning backroom music venue and classic up-front bar. Small bites and reasonably priced drinks abound.

Nightswim is the newest nightlife contender, opening where beloved neighborhood bar The Anchor used to be. It's open past midnight, with an artfully decorated, large interior space and a fun outdoor space.

You might find something going on late night at performance venues Big Cat or the Art Buoy downtown by the Rondout – check it out if you do, because these are some of the funnest, most underground and countercultural events in the area.

Often overlooked as a late-night destination, Patel's Kingston Lanes is a bowling alley and arcade open late on the weekends, with its own well-stocked bar and inimitable, local-friendly atmosphere.

One more late-night Kingston tip: You can't go wrong with Kennedy Fried Chicken, which is open until 2 a.m. on the weekend, 1 a.m. otherwise (and they deliver). Being a Halal establishment that takes pride in putting out a good product, it's fast food that's a cut above.

New Paltz

Summer nightlife in New Paltz can be a paradox. Of all the locations in Ulster County to let loose after hours, this college town is best equipped to take you to the wee hours of the morning. However, college obviously isn't in session during the summer, and while a few students stay behind, the nightlife scene in New Paltz changes drastically after graduation.

Things take a turn for the touristy, but school being out can also be a boon to





locals who have the village's venues more to themselves.

Despite closing at 10 p.m. on weekends, Jar'D Wine Pub in the Water Street Market area deserves an honorable mention as a hidden gem. Great wine and cocktails can be found in this super-cozy bar, and the view of the 'Gunks from the back patio is one of the best in town.

Bacchus also technically closes at 10 p.m., but deserves mention anyway for their encyclopedic beer selection and spacious billiard hall.

Another great pre-game spot. Well, this is awkward. P&G's normally would be a must-stop spot as the quintessential hometown college bar and restaurant. At the time of this writing, jowever, it was operating on a 30-day court-ordered window to sell booze after police caught many underage drinkers imbibing there months ago. Not sure where they'll be at by the time you read this, but it's a great casual spot to unwind.

P&G's counterpart is McGillicuddy's, it being more of a dive/party bar. Things can be more raucous late-night, as it's been known to stay open as late as legally possible. During the summer, you're likely to find a more subdued scene, but there's still action to be found.

The most raucous bar of them all is alternately known as Snug's, Snug Harbor, or Snug Harbor Bar & Grill (the venue itself can't quite decide). With live music that ranges from jam band to punk rock, Snug's has been a New Paltz institution for decades. It's a dive with heart, where inebriated passion can be let loose with abandon. The communal-trough-style urinal in the men's bathroom is an unforgettable experience, Watch out for splashes.


If you want late-night music that's more sophisticated and can be enjoyed without braving a mosh pit, head to The Lemon Squeeze, a piano jazz bar that's open until 1 a.m. on weekends. It's got a

swanky, upscale ambience, well-crafted food and drink, and generally classy vibes.

Also relaxed, but more rustic-chic is Huckleberry, open until midnight every night, with a kitchen that closes at 10 p.m. Don't miss the kitchen – the food here consists of elevated versions of classic dishes. The craft cocktails are inventive. and there's a lot of great beer on tap.

Huckleberry is something of a model example of the new-school Hudson Valley watering-hole style. A little Catskill Mountains, a little Brooklyn, and a lot of love put into the details.

One of the best parts about being out late in New Paltz is that you can grab a slice of pizza between destinations to fuel your late night. Gourmet Pizza is open super-late and has that old-school pizzeria vibe, but Apizza swernes one of the best pies in the county, so try to make it there before it closes at 10:30 p.m.



A complete guide to bears

As told in stories about various encounters with them

veryone has a bear story. And they're always good stories. I'll tell you mine towards the end of this article.

At one point it seemed to me that every person I met in Brooklyn would say: "I love Phoenicia! I went for a hike up in the woods."

"What happened?" I would inquire.

"After five minutes we saw a bear, then turned around and came back."

One thing Brooklynites enjoy is a brush with death, plus an excuse to return to their cabin and read *The New Yorker*.

Never turn your back or run from a bear – it sets off an instinct to make them chase you.

Black bears are quite similar to humans. They are at the top of the food chain, can stand on two legs, and have roughly the same hearing and vision we do.

When I first moved to the area, I lived in Shandaken. My landlords were from New York City, and foolishly put out the garbage every night in plastic bags. A bear – or maybe several bears? – would arrive nightly and forage for a meal.

That's when I learned that these forest creatures have the same food preferences as the average American. If our neighbor was eating spare ribs, the ursine thief would enthusiastically chew on the bones; but encountering our leftover millet and lentils she'd contemptuously thrust them aside. As Yogi Bear famously said: "Nuts and berries: yuck!"

I vividly remember one bear pulling a garbage bag backward across Route 42, glaring at me like a bank robber with a revolver backing out of a bank.

Bear stories, bear strategies

My wife, Violet Snow, kindly wrote out this story for me:

"I had to throw away half a jar of spoiled apple sauce. I couldn't put it in the compost because it would attract bears. So I walked up the mountain behind my house, intending to empty it in a remote spot.

However, I was halfway therewhen I saw a bear walking toward me. I made a loud noise and waved my arms.

"The bear started to walk away, but then changed its mind and decided to walk towards me, perhaps scenting the apple sauce. I panicked for a moment and then uncapped the plastic jar and threw it towards the bear. This strategy worked. The bear stopped to lick up the apple sauce, and I turned

and ran down the mountain. The next day I retrieved the empty jar."

The noted poet Mike Topp has a house in Stanfordville. One night in April, his wife went away, and here's what happened:

"I had a bad feeling and played a Trump podcast out the window (bears are said not to like overhearing talk shows). I soaked a bunch of rags in ammonia and put them on our back porch (bears supposedly hate the smell of ammonia).

And I placed some unwelcome mats (boards with nails sticking out of them) in our yard.

"It didn't matter. I sat on our couch twelve feet from our back porch with its sturdy protection of a sliding glass door to watch a Curb Your Enthusiasm rerun. At 8:32 I glanced out the glass door and saw a large black bear padding around. He saw me, walked over to the glass door, and stood up on his back legs to get a better look at me.

"Like most people relaxing at home, I was fully dressed, wearing shoes and a coat, with my wallet, car keys and a

canister of bear spray by my side. I carefully and slowly walked sideways out of the room (never turn your back or run from a bear - it sets off an instinct to make them chase you) and set off our car alarm over and over. I went down to our locked garage and locked myself in the car with bear spray and all the lights on. I stayed in the car until 4 a.m. and then checked the cameras and went to bed."

Listen to the bear sing

Years go by when I never see a bear, only their scat – which often reveals their

recent dietary decisions. In August, it's common to see wild cherry pits in their droppings. (I asked for bear stories on Facebook, and Deb Medenbach wrote about an intruder who "ate 30 pounds of sunflower seeds off my porch. He gave it back in poopy piles in the garden that the birds could forage. Suet, without

dead animals.")

Several years ago I was walking with my friend Norman, who was desperate to see a bear. "I rarely run into them," I told Norman, but as we were walking across the bridge in Phoenicia, down below was a healthy adult bear, looking into the waters of Esopus Creek, apparently fishing. As we watched, the creature dived into the swift water and swam across, looking exactly like a floating bearskin rug.

Once I moved up here, and began observing the life of four-legged beasts, I was surprised how well the book Winnie the Pooh had prepared me for an understanding of bears. Just like Winnie, they are generally dreamy, plodding, and pleasure-loving.

The second chapter of Winnie the Pooh, entitled "In Which Pooh Goes Visiting, And Gets into a Tight Place," begins with the protagonist "humming proudly to himself." Here is the hum:

Tra-la-la, tra-la-la, Tra-la-la, tra-la-la, Rum-tum-tiddle-um-tum...

If you listen closely to a bear, you will often notice her singing this exact song.

We watch them, they watch us

One Native-American teaching about bears is that they demonstrate how to live a sensible life – balancing rest, survival, and play.

I hate to pollute my essays with useful information, but I feel a responsibility to advise you how to deal with the sudden arrival of a member of the *Ursas americanus*.

First of all, as Violet implies, don't walk around with a pocket full of french fries. Secondly, stand and face the bear boldly. Do not run, and do not move closer.

Thirdly, make yourself as large as possible, by holding out your arms and expanding your poncho to an intimidating

size (assuming you're wearing a poncho).

Fourthly, make lots of noise – for example, sing "Armageddon It" by Def Leppard.

My favorite bear tale is that of my friend Matt, who planted a pear tree on his property in Mount Tremper. After a few years, the tree bore fruit, which attracted a bear – who uprooted the entire tree, and carried it up the mountain to savor privately.

Last week, my friend Phoebe and I took a long circular walk through Phoenicia Park, and then stopped to sit at a picnic table. Just then, a guy walked in with two dogs, one of which sped off toward the woods. "He's chasing that bear," the man muttered between gritted teeth.

Had an ursine sentry been standing at the edge of the woods throughout our walk? Bears are watching us more often than we know.

Sweet Sue becomes Bettina

A new incarnation for a Phoenicia café

HEN SWEET SUE opened in 1984, the cafe opposite the Phoenicia Library became a focal point for Main Street, providing a brunch nook for residents and a boost to other local businesses from visitors to Phoenicia as they lined up outside on weekends for the pancakes. The eatery founded by Suzanne Taylor thrived for decades. It also hit bumps — renovations, septic problems, personnel difficulties, and finally the pandemic. The cafe changed hands for a short time but kept the name. The new owners bought the cafe, keeping the name



Sweet Sue's. Rebecca Shim, who had been working at high-end restaurants in Brooklyn, worked for them as a consultant for six months. When the business folded, she took over the space.

New proprietor Shim has now shifted the menu focus and changed the name to Bettina in honor of her grandmother, who passed down to her a passion for cooking.

Trained as a chef at the French Culinary Institute in Manhattan, Shim later opened two restaurants in Brooklyn. Wanting to learn more about food and where it comes from, she spent time upstate, intending to work on an organic

farm in the Catskills. Instead, she found a job in Woodstock with chocolatier Oliver Kita.

"Iloved the areaso much," Shim recalled.
"I got into my own vegetable gardening, which evolved into a micro-flower farm in Mount Tremper." The result was the Phoenicia Honey Co., which sells local honey infused with flowers and herbs.

"My restaurants in Brooklyn were fine dining, and I always wanted to do something more community-oriented, where I could have fun with food and be creative," she said, "I wanted to feel like people were coming to my home. I feel like that's happening here."

Beyond the pancakes

Don't worry, there are still pancakes.

"People are saying the new pancakes are nearly as good as Sue's," said Shim, who swears she'll never do the ten varieties

Forty years ago, Phoenicia was less a trendy place for refugees from New York City and more the largest hamlet in a rough rural town just west of Woodstock. Sue's customers traveled from far afield

and were willing to wait for a table. The pancakes were the main attraction, along with other breakfast foods and sophisticated lunch options.

With changing times, Shim feels pancakes can no longer hold down the menu. "One of the reasons I decided to



do something completely different is that I don't think anyone can redo what Sue did."

Bettina opened on April 26 with a limited menu of breakfast and lunch options. Among the most popular, Shim said, were "baked French toast, mozzarella panini, the pancakes. And we have a few vegan items. We're also doing a lot of fancy coffees, matcha and cold brew. People grab drinks to go. As the weather gets warm, the salads are selling like crazy."

The menu will continue to shift, as Shim incorporates seasonally plentiful ingredients.

The vegan Bettina Bowl changes composition weekly. In early June, it





consisted of quinoa, tabouli, hummus, grape leaves, Kalamata olives and baby greens.

Atempeh reuben uses a product from Hudson Valley Tempeh, made with chickpeas and without "the sour aftertaste that tempeh sometimes has."

Lorenzina's Panini, named after Shim's mother, has been a customerfavorite. "She was a tenth child, and my grandfather Lorenzo had to have a namesake," she explained,

A small-town anchor

Shim's mom was not excited about cooking, but grandmother Bettina, who came to the U.S. from Abruzzo, Italy at the age of 16, was an avid

cook. "Her love for food is in my DNA." Shim's father, whose family was from Ireland, studied with James Beard and

loved to cook for guests. "I was his little helper at parties."

In Brooklyn, Shim had apprenticed for chef, teacher and author Edna Lewis, considered the grande dame of Southern cooking, offering farm-to-table cuisine before it was chic. "She taught me about simplicity and respecting ingredients."

As the pandemic waned, Shim, who had been earning a living through private chef work, bachelorette parties, and fancy dinners for people from the city, eyed the closed cafe on Main Street and considered renting it. "I hate to see empty storefronts in Phoenicia. I love the town, and it feels important to have a cafe as an anchor in a small town, a place for people to meet, grab something to eat and a coffee. And it should be affordable, so it's not only geared to tourists."

A corner of Bettina's main room displays products on sale from local businesses, 80 percent of them run by women. Weathertop Farm offers switchels, shrub, and bitters that can be used to make sodas or added to cocktails. Other items include fine teas, maple syrup, tahini, halvah, date butter, and chocolate-covered dates.

Shim plans to branch out into catering. The side dining room will become available as a party space, and eventually will open on weekend evenings.

"As somebody who's lived here for 25 years," she said, "I'm trying to understand what the town really needs, and it's more than just pancakes. I'm trying to fill a niche with all-around food options."







Half Moon Rondout Cafe & Adelaar Farm Market

Biweekly market Wednesdays and Sundays

Half Moon Rondout Café at 83 Broadway, best known all over the county for its babka, will soon be one of the only twicea-week markets in the Hudson Valley. In its new space just up the street from its old location, it will be offering fresh pastries, sandwiches. locally roasted coffee and made-to-order hot donuts every day.

Half Moon and Adelaar Farms, a local family-owned-andoperated farm which utilizes all-organic practices to grow its produce and flowers, will collaborate to make use of Half Moon's alleyway to distribute fresh produce and flowers. Blueberries, strawberries, lettuce, herbs, and dozens of flower varieties will be available throughout the summer. There will be potatoes and other vegetables in the fall. Seedlings, seed starter kits, herbs, and meal kits will also be

In addition the spacious new dining room with big windows, will hold monthly workshops and events like seed planting, bouquet arranging, flower pressing, natural dying, crocheted flowers, donut painting, and other crafts and activities.

PonckHockie Market Last Saturday of every month

The PonckHockie Market, a community food co-op at 75 Lindsley Avenue, incorporates culture and community in a new grassroots market intended as a cornerstone for community development and engagement. The first market in May celebrated Native-American, Haitian-American, and Jewish-American heritages, with vendors offering a wide range of food, Programming including a doctor and a chef, and produce like local eggs, local chicken, apples, greens, pork chops, ribs, beets, and more.

"The PonckHockie Market is not just a grocery store, It's a community revolution, born from the need for accessible, healthy food in Ponckhockie, a neighborhood in Kingston recognized as a food desert," according to the founders.

The market sets prices based on what customers can afford, and all profits made go back to local nonprofits chosen by the market's members. Created by Community Action of Ulster County and Thrive On! Network and supported by food from The Farm Hub, the market features a new curation of local flavors and cultures each month.
